The election for the European parliament

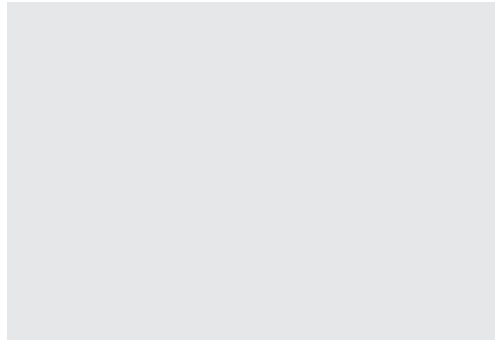
takes place on 25th of Mai 2014 here in Saxony. EU citizens may perceive their suffrage either in their current residence in the European Union or in their country of birth.

If you want to give your vote in Saxony to a German Party, you have to:

- Be a citizen of the European Union
- Be older than 18 years
- Have a registered residence in Saxony
- Be registered until 4th of Mai 2014 in the electoral Register

For that you have to report at the election office of your community (in most of the cases these are the civil offices). There you get a form of the federal election chief, which may be filled out on site and with which you apply for registration.

Whom shall I give my vote?

At the election for the European parliament every vote has to be heard, among them also the votes of those who left their countries of birth, regardless of the reasons. Sometimes these are very private reasons, but more often the coercion is born from the economic crisis, forcing the people to find labour and a new centre point of live in another country. Saving programmes, which the so called “Troika” imposes on the home countries, are making it almost impossible for many people to develop a life perspective. The European Institutions are pressing on spending cuts, especially in the social sector and services of public general interest. The results are economic depression, suffering and a lack of perspectives for the poorer people in every member state of the EU. The “Merkel-Policy” is significantly responsible for that.

For all these reasons we say, that only a strengthening of DIE LINKE at the European elections may contribute to change the political basic direction in Europe to a more social and solidary policy.
